- Length:

  - Japanese Essays: Up to 600 characters.
- **Content:** Your essay should clearly describe your connection to Ehime. This could include:
  - Personal memories of Ehime.
  - Your interest in Ehime.
  - What you've learned about Ehime (from family, research, etc.).
  - o Appealing stories that make people want to visit Ehime.

#### **How to Submit your essay**

You have two options for completing the sheet:

- Handwritten: Print the form and complete it by hand.
- Typed: Type your essay directly onto the Google Doc.

After completing your essay, convert it to a PDF document:

- If handwritten, scan the completed page to create a PDF.
- If typed in Google Docs, download your essay as a PDF.

#### **How Essays Will Be Judged**
